




The October General Meeting was an intimate gathering with a noticeable improvement in the food offering. Good food, Good wine with Good Company, what else could you ask for.

During our time in the UK we did not seek out or attend any ex-pat haunts in London. Our social time, being spent entertaining relatives and friends from Australia and the US, so there were numerous trips to Heathrow to pick up visitors that usually arrived at 6.00am on any morning. The trip there would take 30 minutes and if on a week day, two hours for the return journey home in London traffic.

We found that our most enjoyable time was attending the events and functions of the South East Region of the Bentley Drivers Club. We were welcomed into their circle even though we were Australians and it was always a delight to catch up with the group whether at Noggin and Natter evenings, summer garden parties or on the planned weekend events.

On several occasions, we would visit Sue's cousins, one in Edinburgh and the other on the Outer Hebrides. The trip to the Outer Hebrides was a 2-day trip

with an overnight stop usually in a B&B in Uig up in the north west corner of the Isle of Skye so that we could catch the departing ferry for the 2-hour crossing to Uest. The return journey was dictated by the ferry timetable so the return trip took 2 days to arrive back in London.

The Le Mans Classic

We went on a Club organised trip to the Le Mans Classic event. We drove to Dover, leaving home at around 6am, to catch the ferry to Calais and then drive to our accommodation in Saint- Leonard- des- Bois, a 30-kilometre drive to the circuit. We arrived in the afternoon and met up with the other members and relaxed waiting for the group dinner in the hotel. The dinner was delightful and as we had a long day all went off to retire for the evening knowing that we had an 8.00am departure to the circuit in the morning. We set off in convoy heading to Le Mans travelling through small villages

along the way with the locals out watching the passing parade. We had been assigned a club parking area close to the circuit which made our arrival reasonably stress free. Everyone then established their camp near their cars and enjoyed the racing and other a.

There were events happening in the evening at the circuit but most decided to return "home "and have a dinner stop on the way. Over dinner it was decided that we were all enjoying each other's company that we would forego the trip to the circuit on Sunday and just enjoy a relaxing time around the hotel. By the time we had arrived back Saint-Leonard-des-Bois were informed that the club had won the Club Trophy and it would be presented during the day on Sunday. So back to the circuit with our cars to attend the presentation of the magnificent trophy. It was another day for socialising with our fellow members. The pictures tell the story.

On Monday morning we all left to return to the UK, some setting out for their ferry trip from Cherbourg and others off to Calais. All agreed that it was a most enjoyable trip. We returned again for the 2010 event.

The Jewel That is Jordan 2008

After seeing an advertisement in the UK Bentley Magazine, we decided to join a group planning a 2-week trip to Jordan.

Our car was picked up and taken to Southampton 8 weeks before the event started to allow for all the cars to be transported to Aqaba in Jordan, including one of the 6 original drophead 8 litre Bentleys. We followed by air to Amman and then a charter flight to Aqaba where we collected our cars from the port and made ready to depart on 2 weeks of driving around Jordan. There were 24 cars at the dock so after collection just after lunch, we went back to our hotel and gave them a wash. While in

Aqaba we were loaded onto a bus and taken out to the Wadi Rum to view the landscape, TE Lawrence Falls (no water) and a parade of a Jordanian Army patrol on camels. In the evening we all met for dinner and enjoyed the meal and the opportunity to meet our travelling companions.

We left Aqaba in convey the next morning with a police escort that would accompany us for the whole trip. We headed to the Dead Sea where we stayed at the Movenpick Hotel and Spa which would be our base for a few days. From here we drove out to nearby attractions on each day, and enjoy lunches locally and return to the hotel in the afternoon to freshen up and continue socialising over dinner. This was the formula for the remainder of the trip.

We saw most of the historic sites including Petra, the Roman ruins in Jerash, Madaba, Mt Nebo, the site on the Jordan River where Jesus was baptised, and some of the castles in different parts of the

We travelled on to Amman where we enjoyed an afternoon tea with the British High Commissioner who had invited the Australian Ambassador to join us. We also enjoyed a visit to the King's stable, his personal car collection and an evening Gala Dinner hosted by the King's sister and sister-in-law. We were introduced to the two Princesses at the start of the evening, both were fans of the television show "Neighbours "and wanted to know the latest developments in the soap. We could not help them as we had never seen an episode of the show.

After this we travelled back to Aqaba to deliver our cars back to the dock for transportation back to the UK. During the trip the financial crisis hit causing considerable concern for most of the touring party, but we found the trip a most memorable one. Even our police escort enjoyed it as they were forced to keep up with the crazy W.O. owners who could not resist the open roads and I saw 100mph on my speedo a number of times keeping up with them.


We flew from Aqaba to Amman and then on to London and the car arrived at our doorstep 6 weeks later.




